

### ◆ History

- Dec. 1982** The KWDI Act was passed by the National Assembly. It owes its passage to the U.N. Declaration of International Women's Year (1975), the U. N. Decade for Women (1976-1985), and Korean women who shared the worldwide recognition that women's full and equal participation is essential to the world's development and peace.
- Apr. 1983** The Korean Women's Development Institute was established under the superintendence of the Ministry of Health and Social Affairs.
- Jan. 1999** KWDI was placed under the supervision of the National Research Council for Humanities and Social Sciences.
- May. 2005** KWDI was placed under the supervision of the National Research Council for Economic, Humanities and Social Sciences.
- Nov. 2006** KWDI held its CI (corporate identity) declaration ceremony in order to take a leap as a world-famous women's policy research institute.
- Jun. 2007** GM(Gender Mainstreaming) Research Department/Family Policy Research Department is established

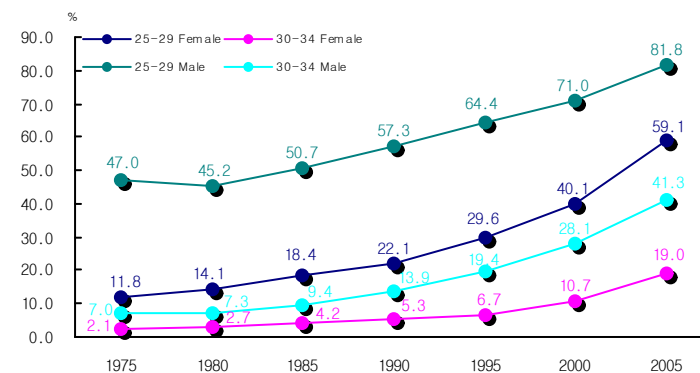

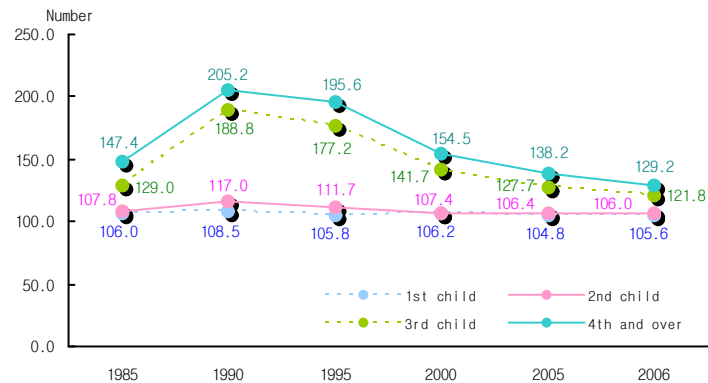

Table 3 Sex Ratio at Birth by Birth Order



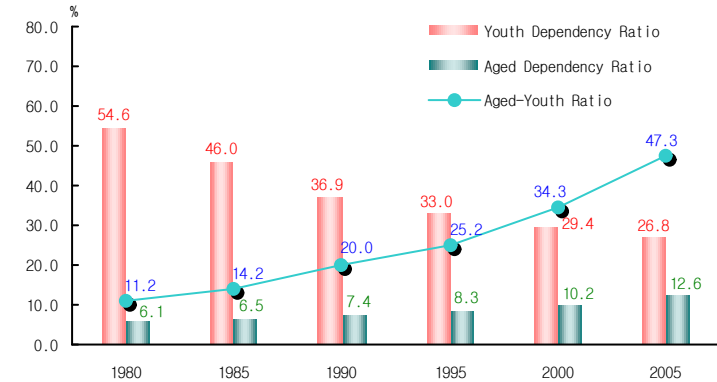

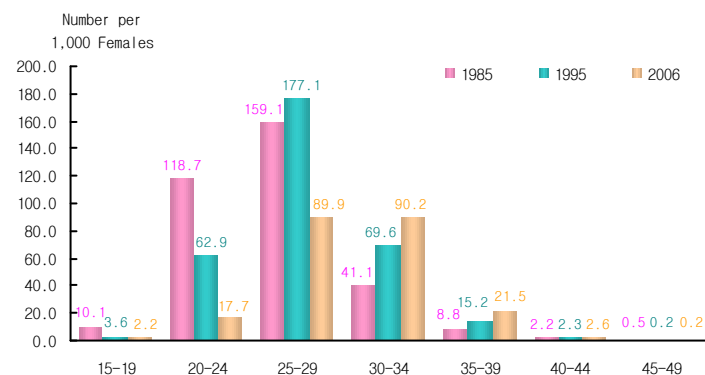

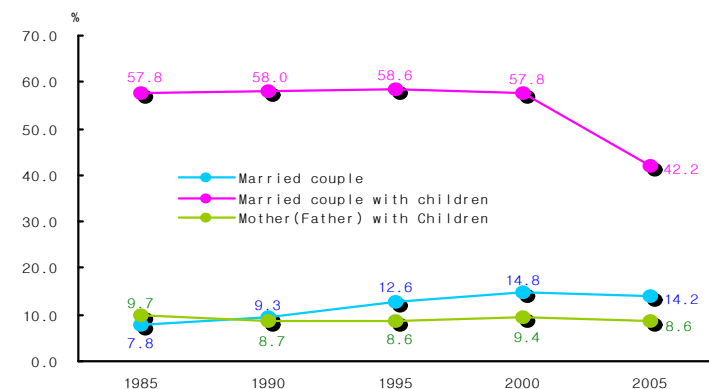

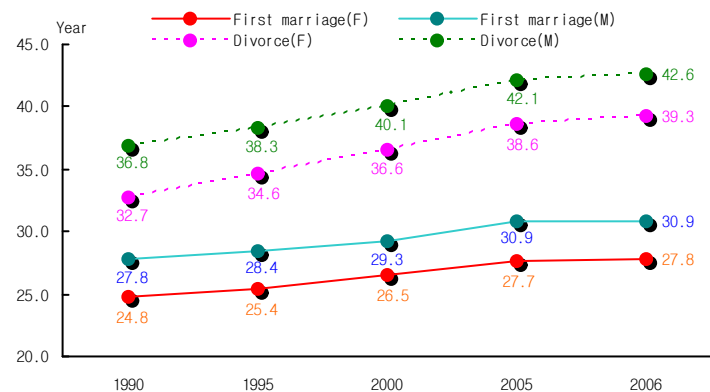

Table 7 Age of First Marriage, Divorce and Remarriage

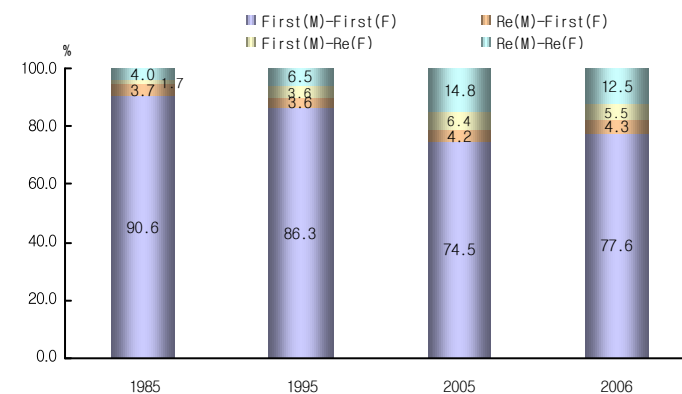

Table 8 Frequency of Marriage by Previous Marital status



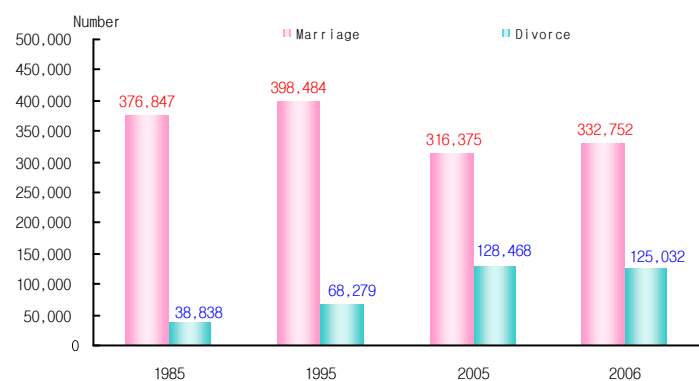

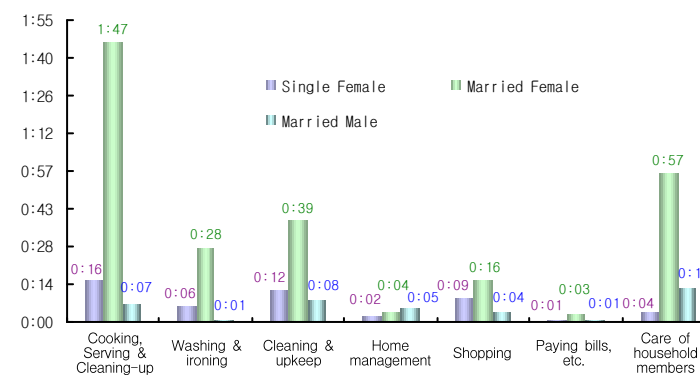

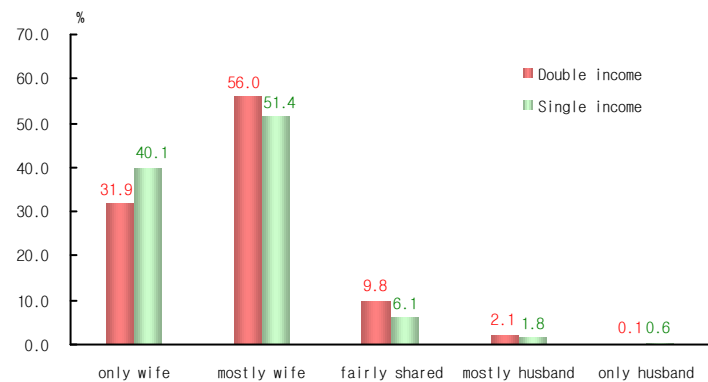

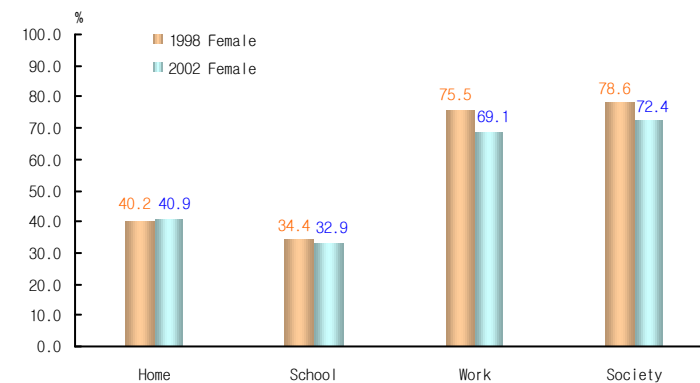

Table 12 Perception of Sexual Discrimination



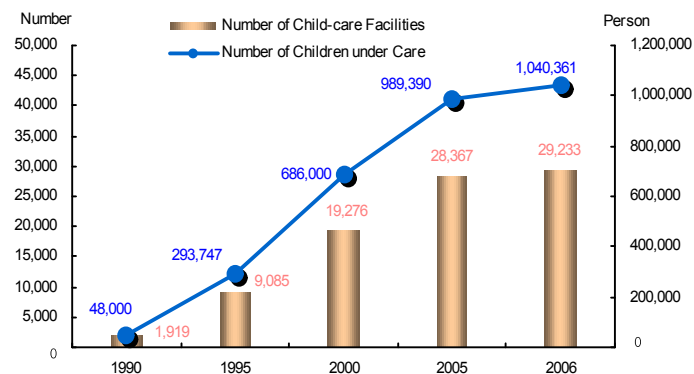

Table 13 Child-care Facilities and Children at Day Care Center

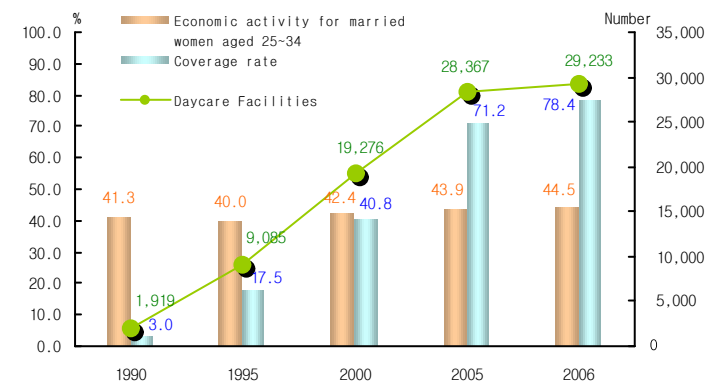

Table 48 Estimation of Day Care Centers' Coverage for the Children (0-5 Years) of Working Mothers

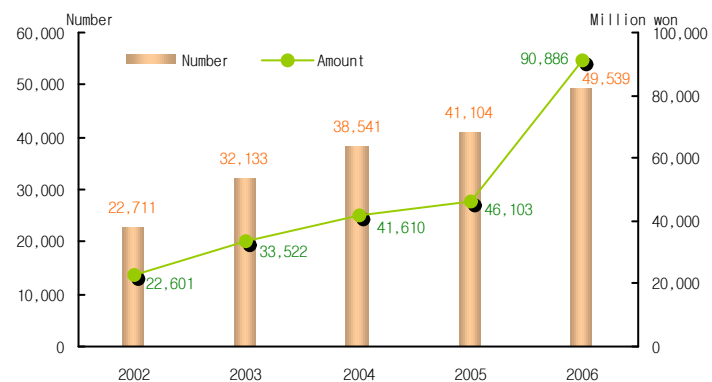

Table 46 Maternity Leave and Parent Leave



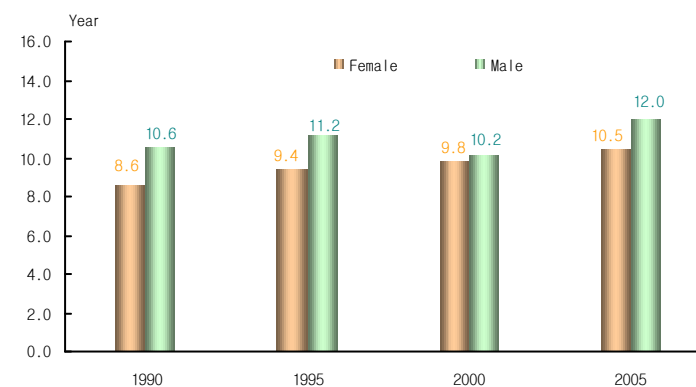

Women's Average Years of Schooling by Age

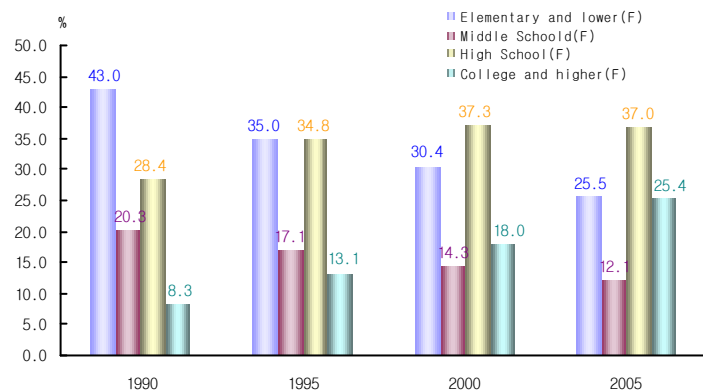

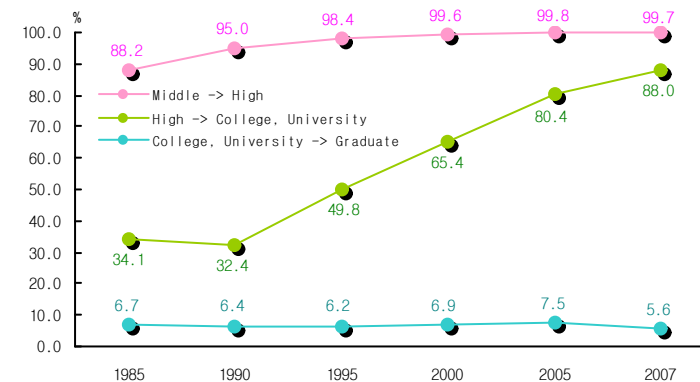

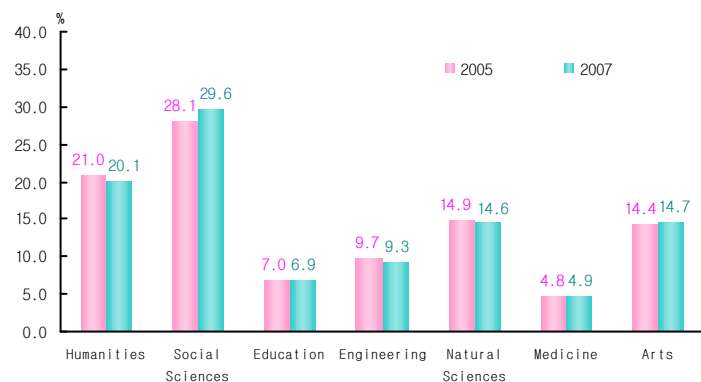

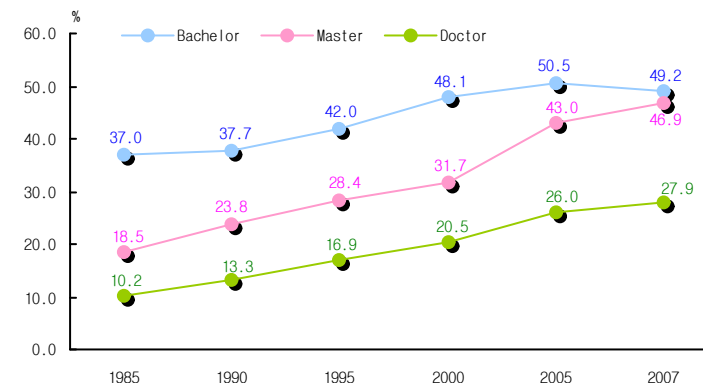

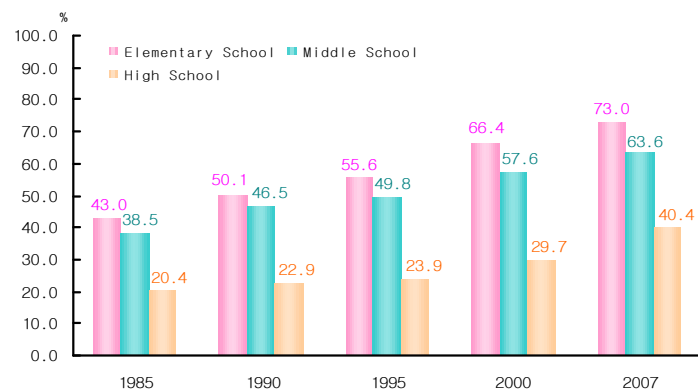

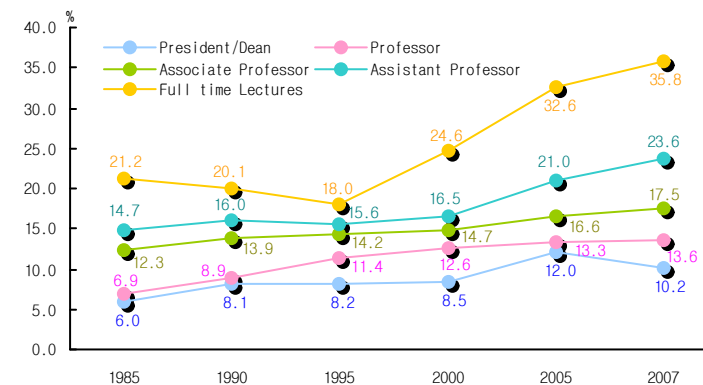

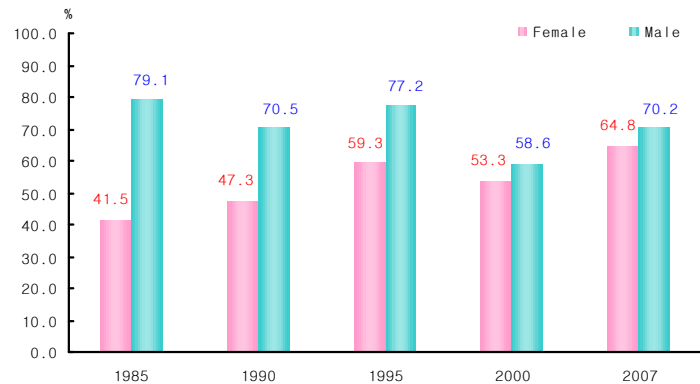

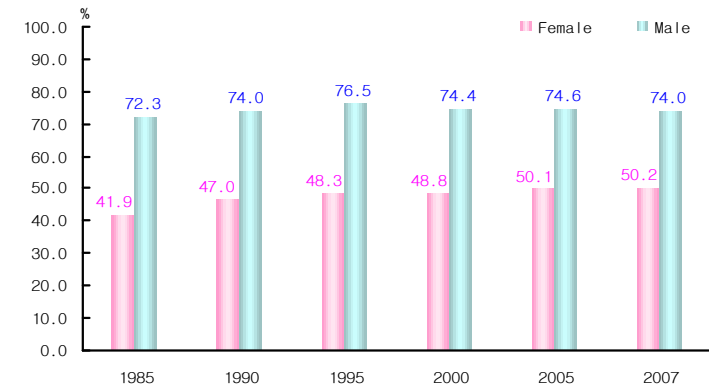

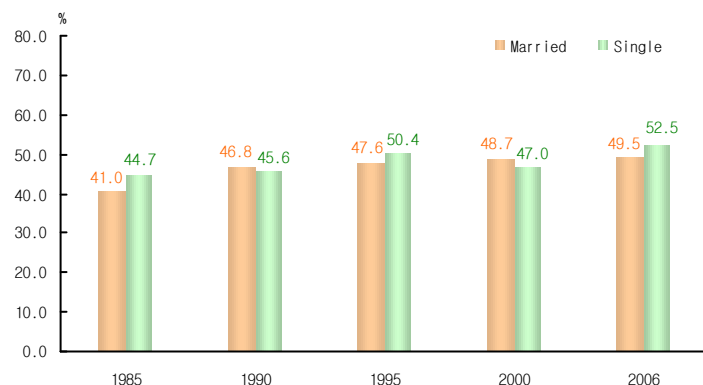

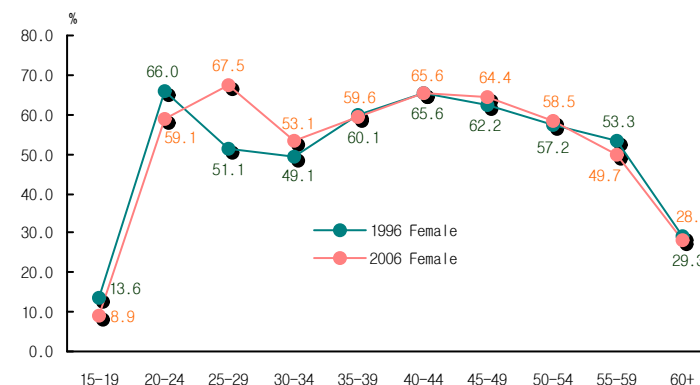

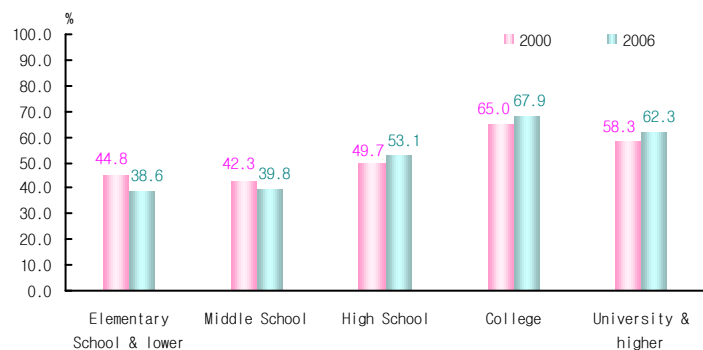

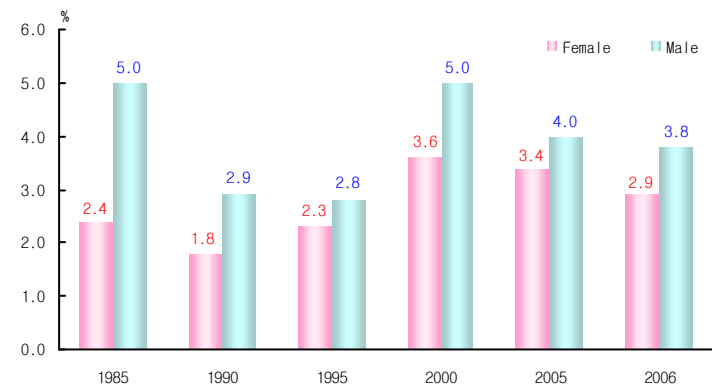

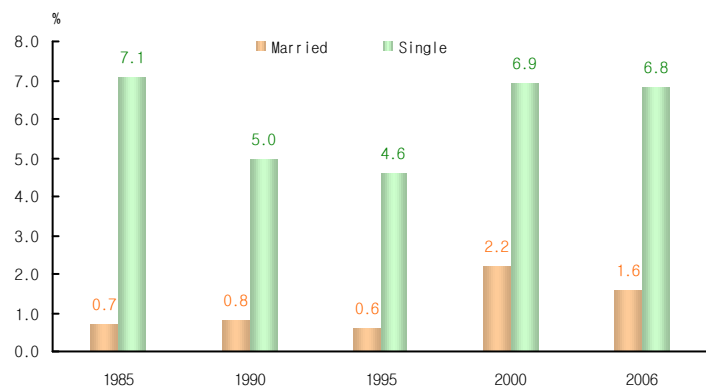

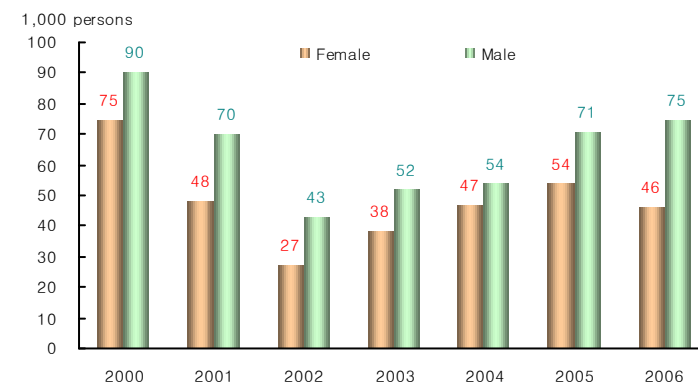

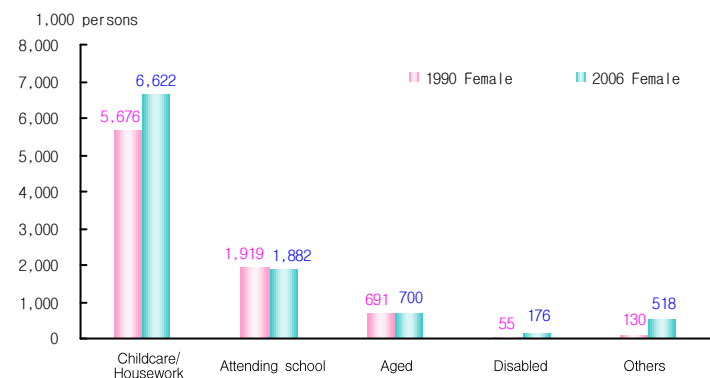

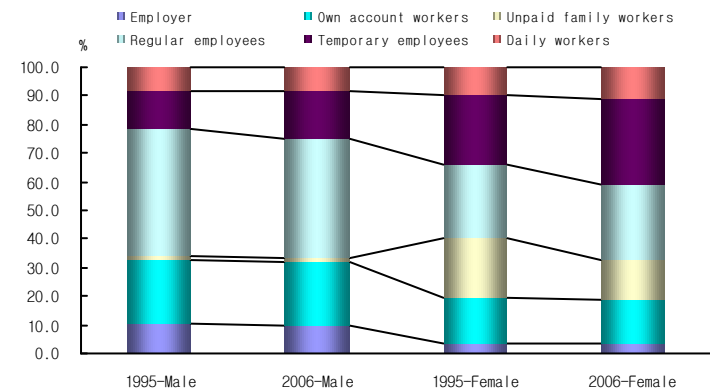

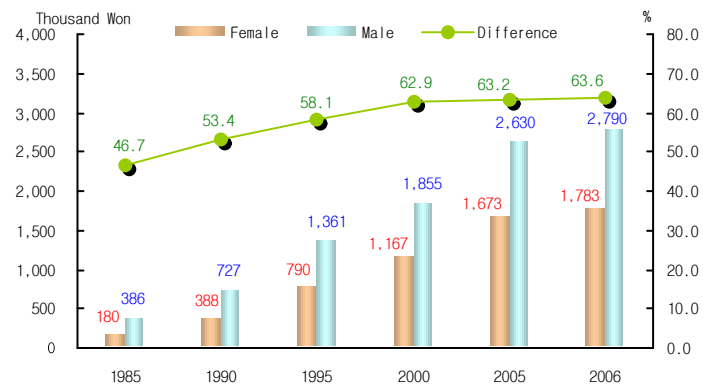

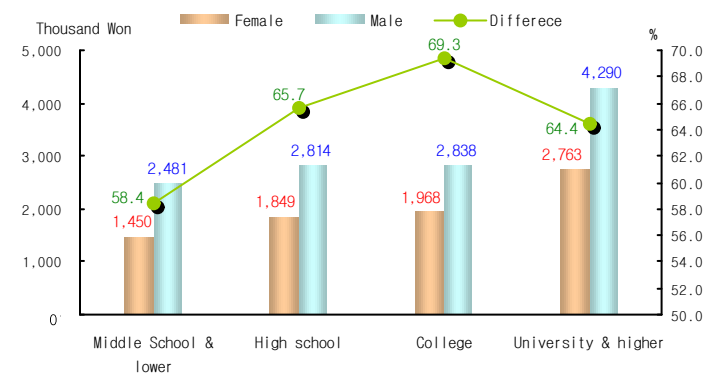

Table 29 Average Monthly Wage by Educational level



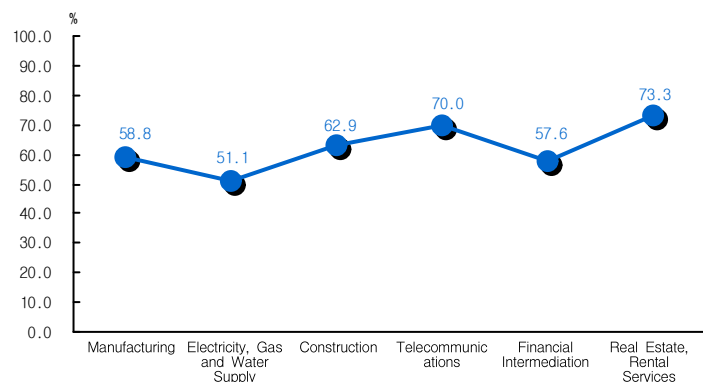

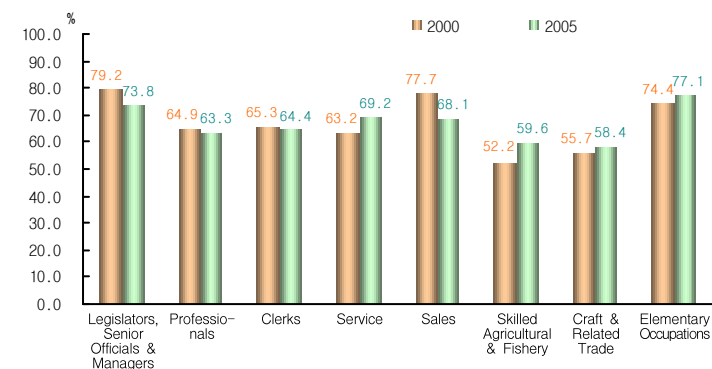

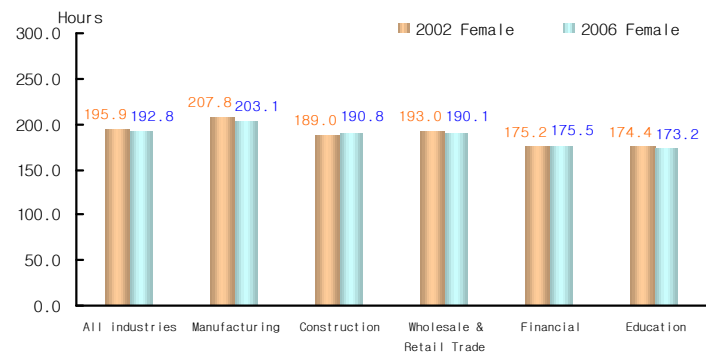

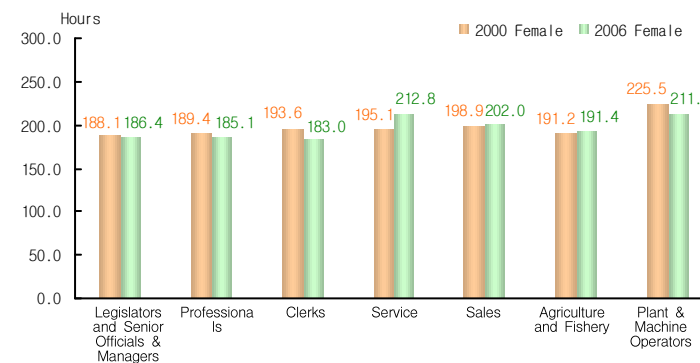

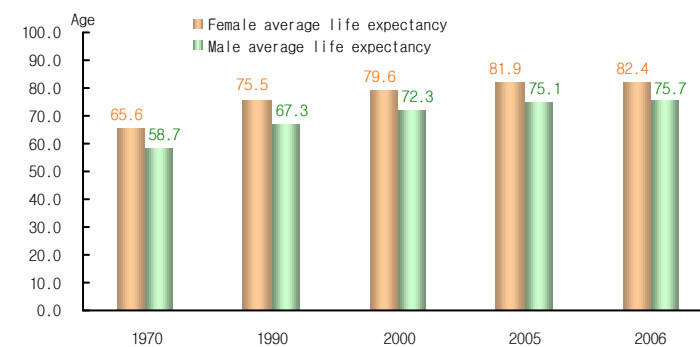

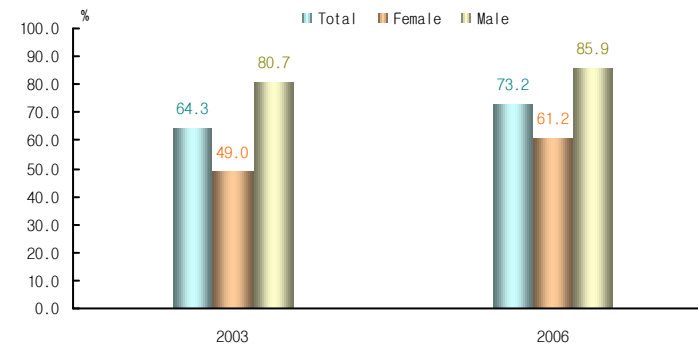

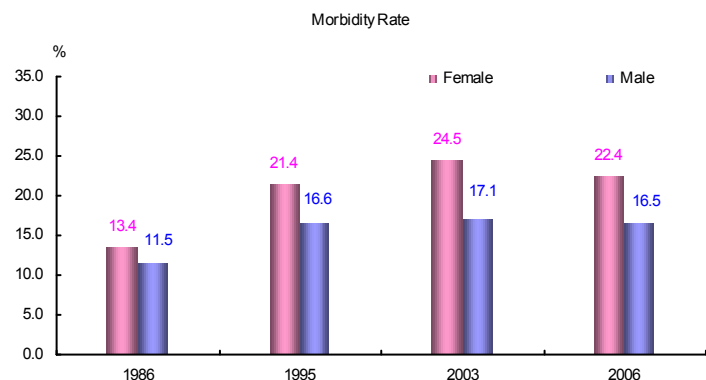

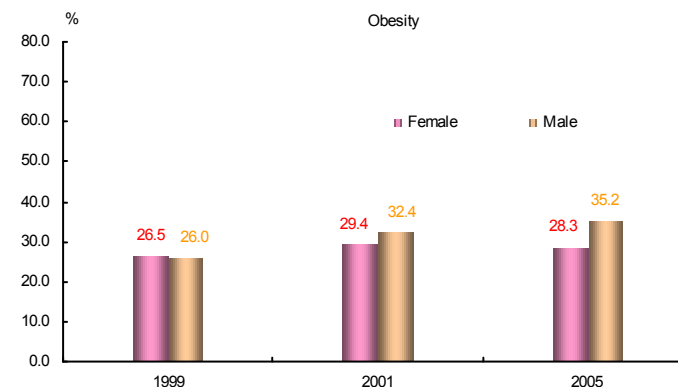

Table 38 Prevalence of obesity among 20 and older



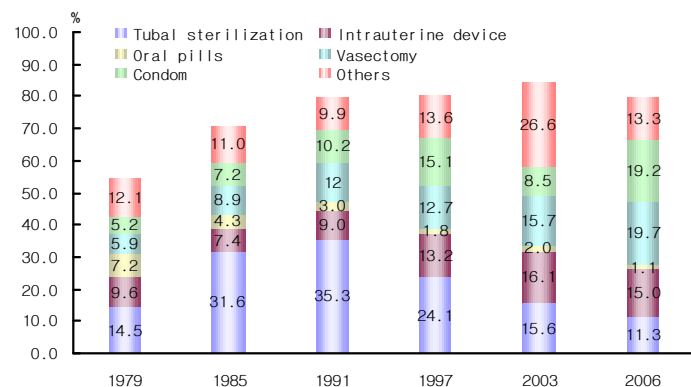

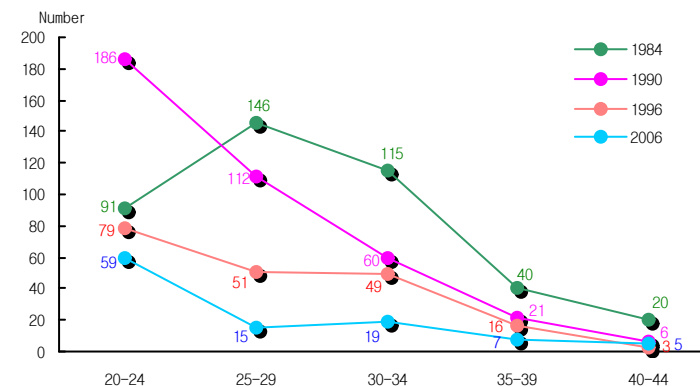

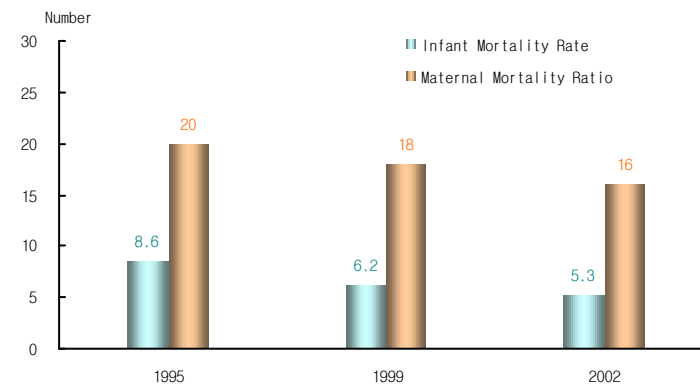

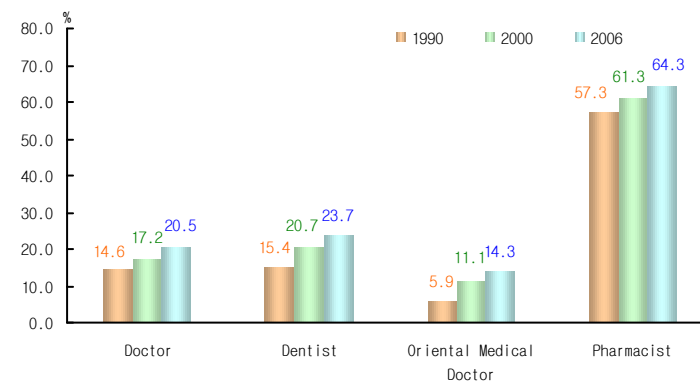

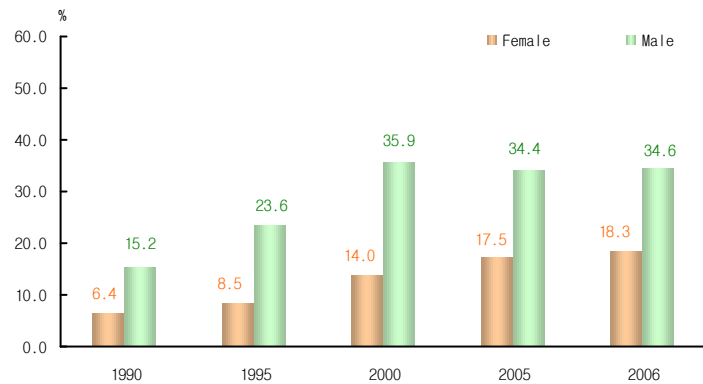

Table 44 National Pension Coverage Rate



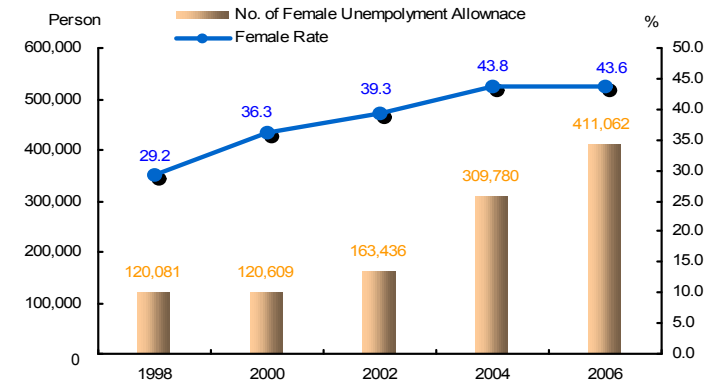

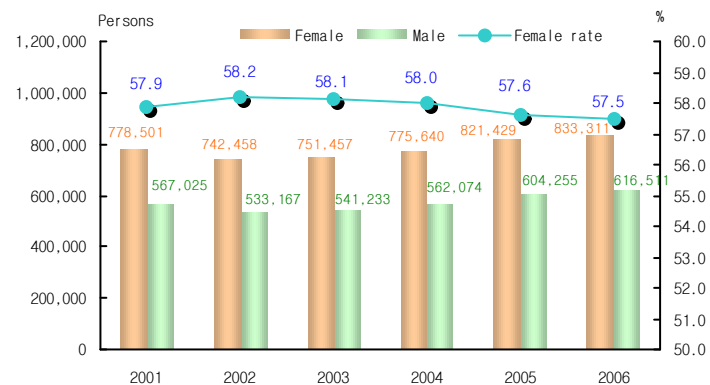

Table 45 Basic Livelihood Security Recipients

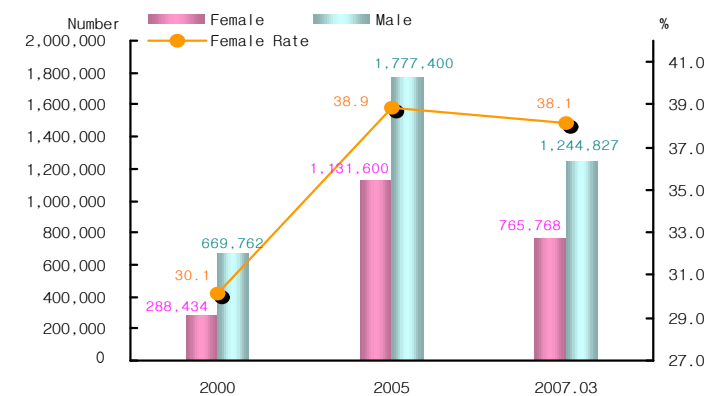

Table 47 Registered People with Disabilities

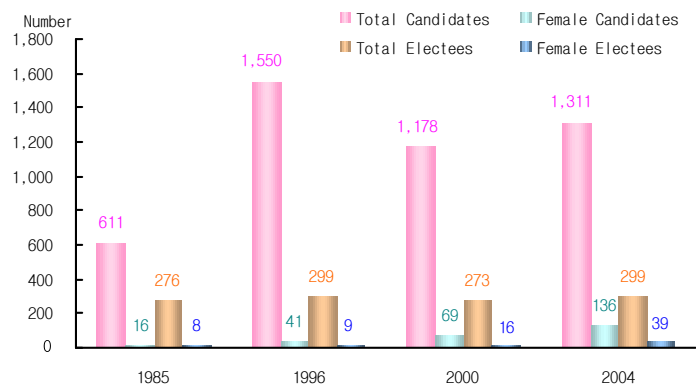

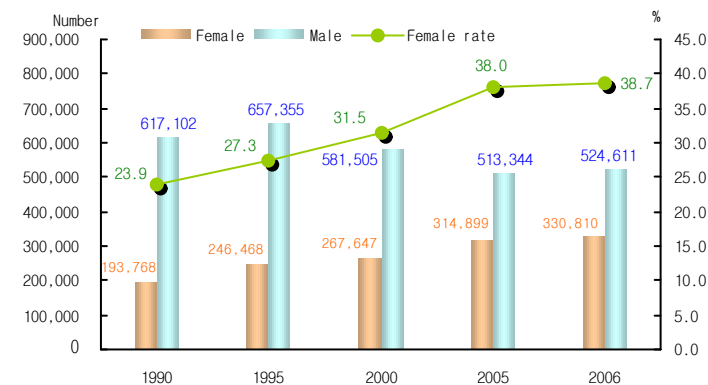

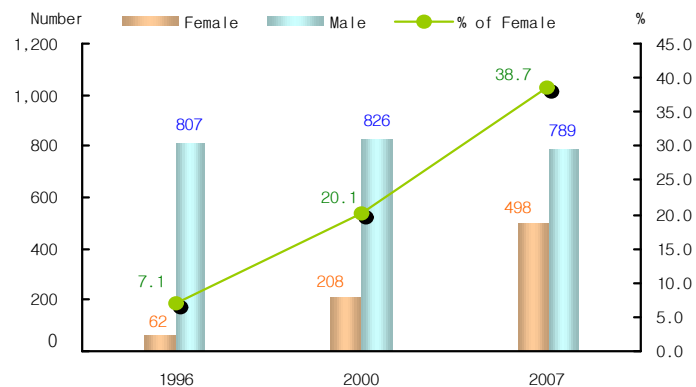

Table 51 Successful Applicant Rate in High Examination

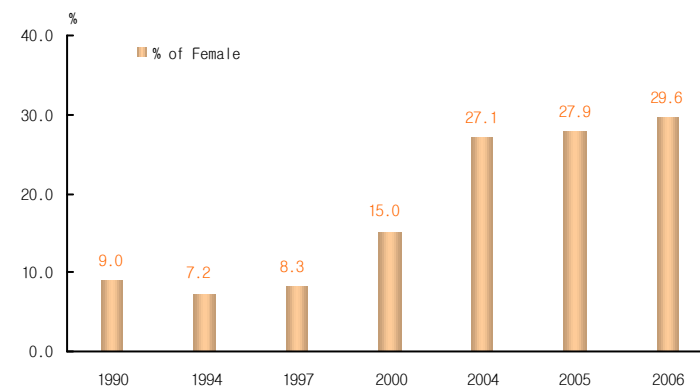

Table 52 Women's Participation in Governmental Committees

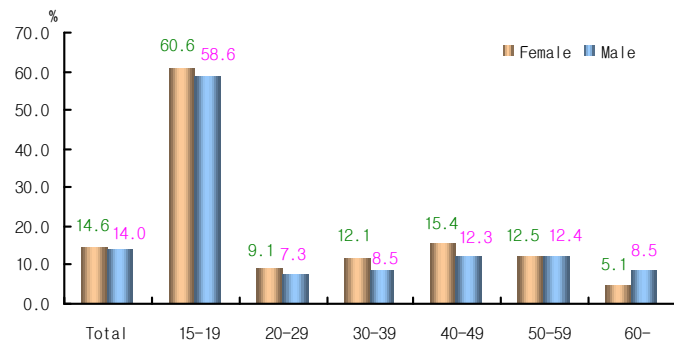

## Participation Rate in Voluntary Services



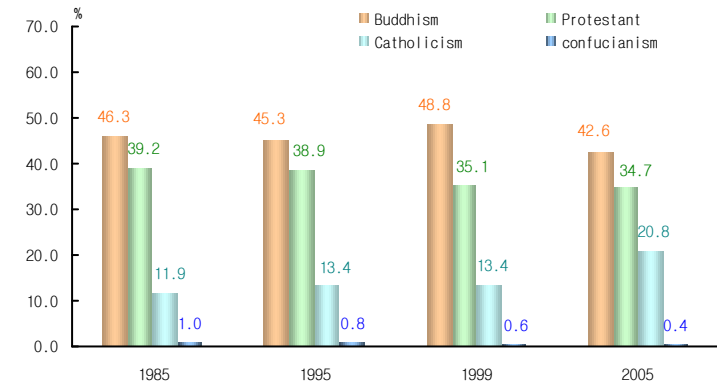

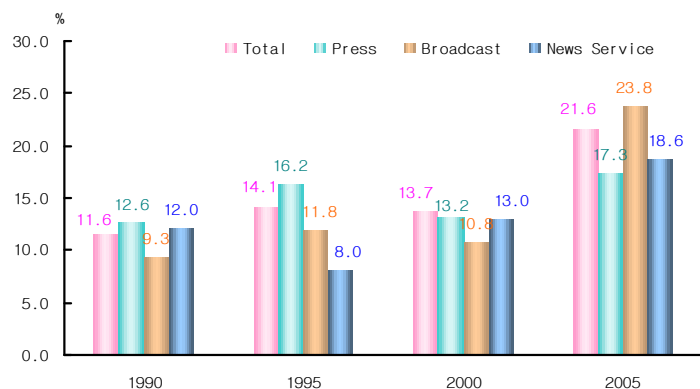

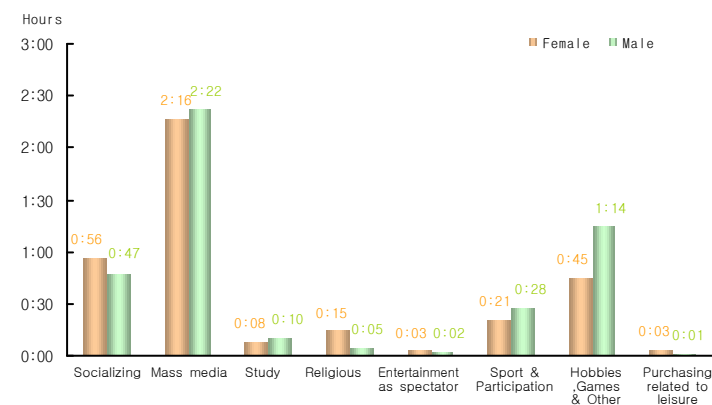

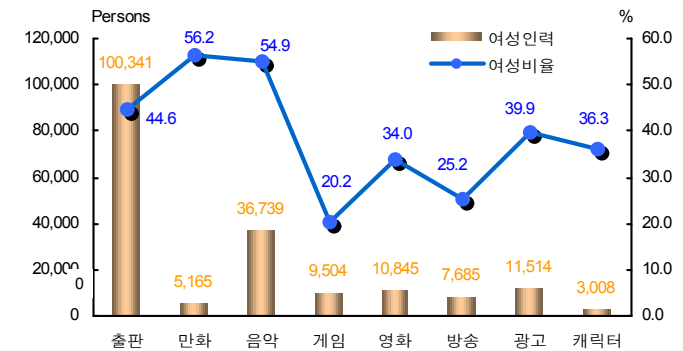

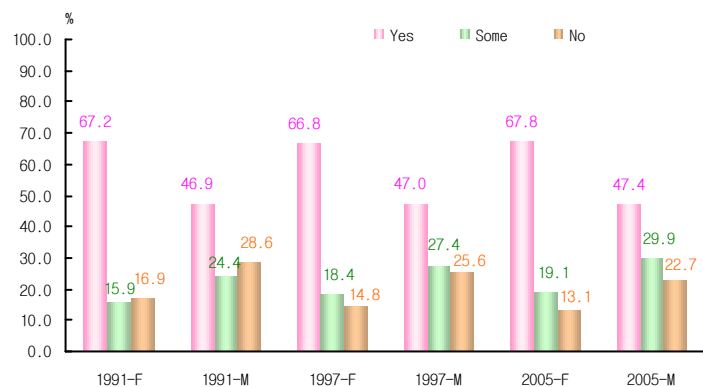

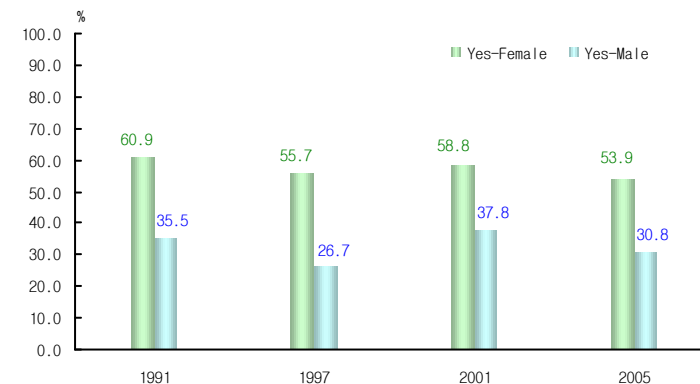

Table 58 Fear of Walking at Night and Measures Taken



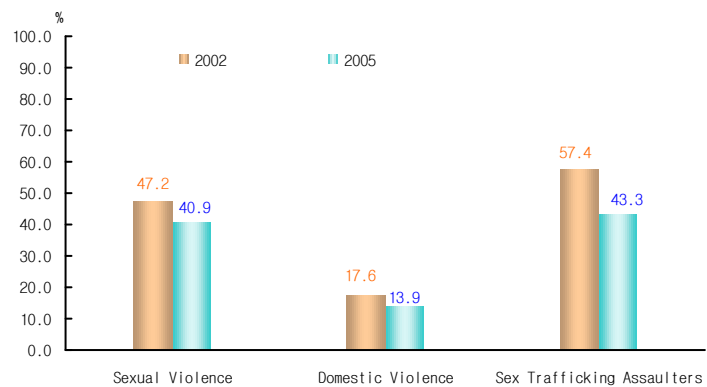

**Table 58 Prosecution Rate of Sexual Violence, Domestic Violence and Sex Trafficking Assaulters**

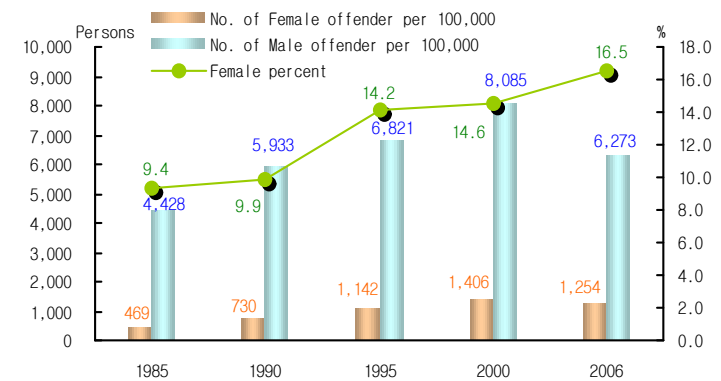

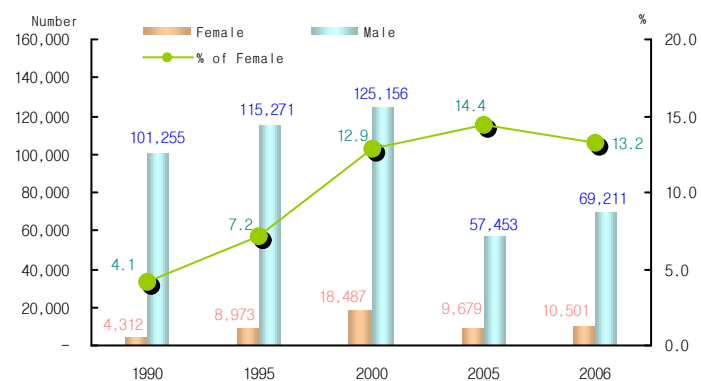

Table 61 Percentage of Juvenile Delinquent

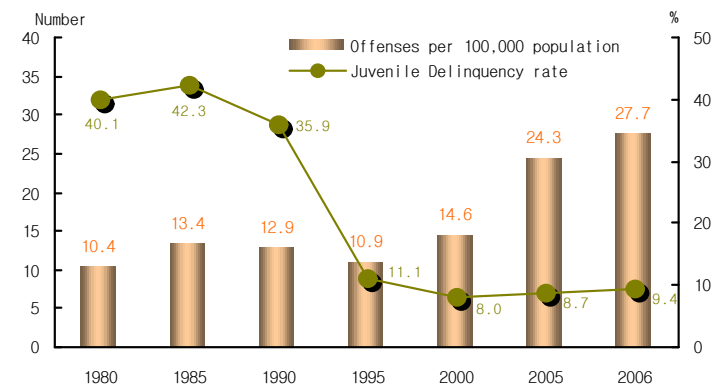

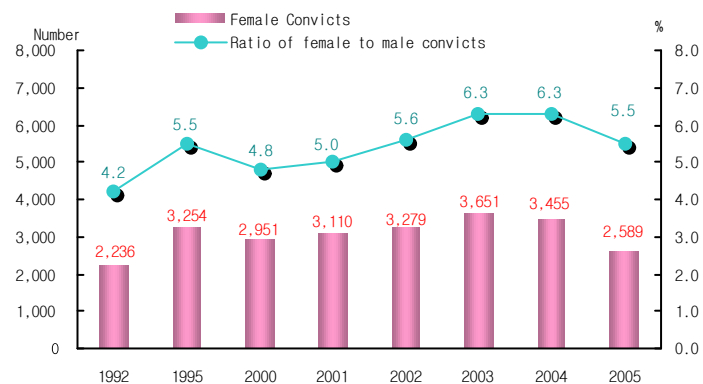

Table 63 Number of Women Prisoners

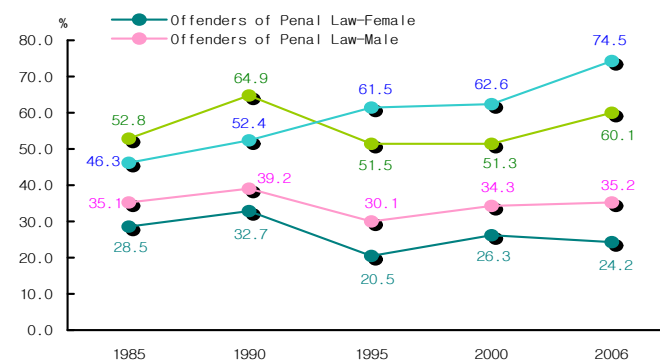

Table 63 Prosecution Rate by Type of Law



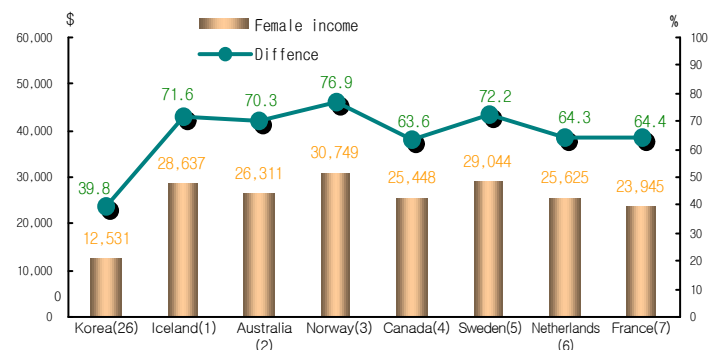

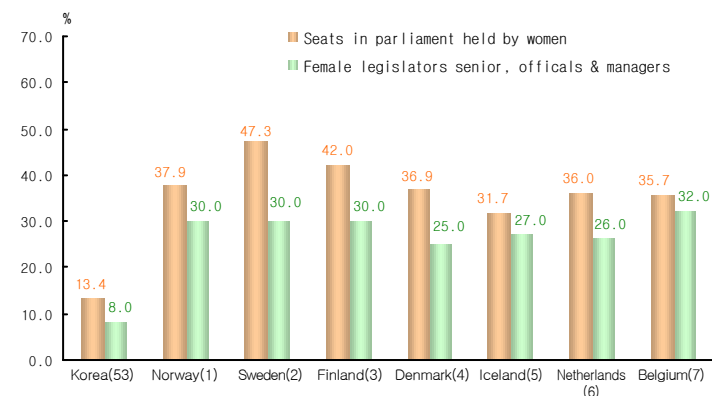
