





































Table 24 Percentage of Women Professors in Higher Educational Institutions









Table 29 Economic Activity by Educational Level





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Table 32 Female Unemployment Rate by Marital Status

















Table 39 Average Monthly Wage by Industry





















Table 52 Prevalence of Contraceptive Practice among Married Women Aged 15-44

















Table 61 Poverty Rate of Female Householder's Household
































